New Business

- 1) Consideration of a Resolution of the Industrial Development Authority of the County of Prince William Approving the Modification of the Authority's Educational Facilities Revenue Bond (the Catholic Diocese of Arlington) Series 2016 This Bond, part of the financing for Saint John Paul the Great Catholic High School, is currently outstanding and is payable in full on December 1, 2027. The Bond interest rate is currently based on the LIBOR rate. In contemplation of the cessation of LIBOR on June 30, 2023, the Diocese, the Authority, and the Lender desire to amend the Bond, the Note, the Basic Transaction Agreement, and each of the other documents executed in connection with the issuance of the bond to provide for the replacement of LIBOR with the SOFR rate Michael W. Graff, Partner, McGuireWoods, Bond Counsel to the Prince William County IDA; Eric Ballou and Megan Gilliland, Counsel to the Catholic Diocese of Arlington
- 2) Authorize the Execution of Amendment One to the Performance Agreement Among Prince William County, the Industrial Development Authority of the County of Prince William, and Caerus Discovery, LLC, Approving \$200,000 as a Grant from the Previously Committed Covid 19 Response Special Revenue Fund to Help Fund the Purchase of a Critical Piece of Equipment for the Life Science Community Accessible Vivarium Caerus Discovery, LLC, is requesting a \$200,000 grant from Prince William County to partially offset the cost of a modular in vivo imaging system for the Caerus Vivarium. This specific piece of equipment is critical for evaluating the effects of therapeutics in rodent models, thus providing the experimental validation needed for eventual testing in human subjects (i.e., clinical trials). The Caerus Vivarium is available to all life science companies in Prince William County and Northern Virginia. Brentsville Magisterial District. The Prince William Board of County Supervisors approved Amendment One at its March 7, 2023 meeting Tom Flynn, Deputy Director, Prince William County Department of Economic Development
- 3) Authorize the Execution of a Performance Agreement Among Prince William County, the Industrial Development Authority of the County of Prince William, and George Mason University to Provide a Virtual Entrepreneur in Residence to Support Prince William County Life Science Companies The Virginia Biotechnology Association (Virginia Bio) was awarded Go Virginia Funding to serve as the central managing hub for Virginia Bio-Connect, a multi-regional collaboration designed to increase connectivity and awareness of the existing programs, resources, and communities in the

Commonwealth that support the life sciences industry. The Virginia Bio-Connect program included establishing a team of successful life sciences mentors with industry-specific expertise and relevant professional networks necessary to support the advancement of established early-to-seed-stage companies. The Go Virginia Grant funded three of the requested four life sciences mentors, and Virginia Bio contracted with George Mason University to hire these mentors. This agreement with George Mason University would fund the fourth life sciences business mentor (Virtual Entrepreneur in residence - VERN), who will be dedicated to Prince William County life sciences companies. This individual will be a Mason Small Business Development Center employee – County-Wide. The Prince William Board of County Supervisors approved this Performance Agreement at its March 7, 2023 meeting – Tom Flynn, Deputy Director, Prince William County Department of Economic Development
